Modern Day and Legacy Fish Records

Thirteen existing species records do not have the standard documentation of today's record fish. Records that cannot be verified have been placed in the Legacy Record Fish category (Table 1). These records would remain on the books and be forever etched in fisheries lore.

A Modern Day Record Fish record category has been created by these vacated records. To apply for this category, the fish must meet the minimum qualifying weights in Table 2.
